A C H I E V E M E N T S

During May, with the assistance of 4 local partner organizations and medical establishments, CHAP/Azerbaijan provided assistance valued at over \$135,600 to more than 47,300 IDPs and other vulnerable Azerbaijan groups.

During May, Counterpart International's *Community and Humanitarian Assistance Program* conducted food distribution valued at over \$ 76,000 to 2,008 IDPs families living in regions of Sheki and Hajigabul of Azerbaijan in response to the appeal from IDPs concerning the poor living conditions and lack of food.

CHAP/Azerbaijan conducted food distribution to the following communities:

- Community of IDPs living in the region of Hajigabul, Azerbaijan;
- Community of IDPs living in the region of Sheki, Azerbaijan.

During May, Counterpart International's *Community and Humanitarian Assistance Program* also started medical and clothing distribution. The shipment consisted of scarves, duffel bags, sleeping mats, wheelchairs, oxygenerators, assembly oxygen hoses and various medical supplies. The assistance valued at over \$63,000 was provided to 919 IDPs living in the region of Gebele and to the Central Hospital of Agjebedi. CHAP/Azerbaijan conducted clothing and medical distributions to the following recipients:

- Central Hospital of the region of Agjebedi, Azerbaijan;
- Community of IDPs living in the region of Gebele, Azerbaijan.

IDP Assistance

As part of ongoing program CHAP/Azerbaijan will continue to provide the humanitarian assistance to IDPs living in different regions of Azerbaijan. As result of this program CHAP/Azerbaijan will receive 1065 sleeping bags valued at over \$132,000, which will be distributed to 789 IDPs families living in the region of Ismailli, Azerbaijan. Over than 10 years, hundreds of thousands internally displaced people (IDPs) in Azerbaijan are living in poorest conditions. As usual, this assistance will be the next gift and support from Counterpart International's Community and Humanitarian Assistance Program to IDPs living in different regions of Azerbaijan.

The shipment with sleeping bags will arrive to Baku on June 07, 2002.

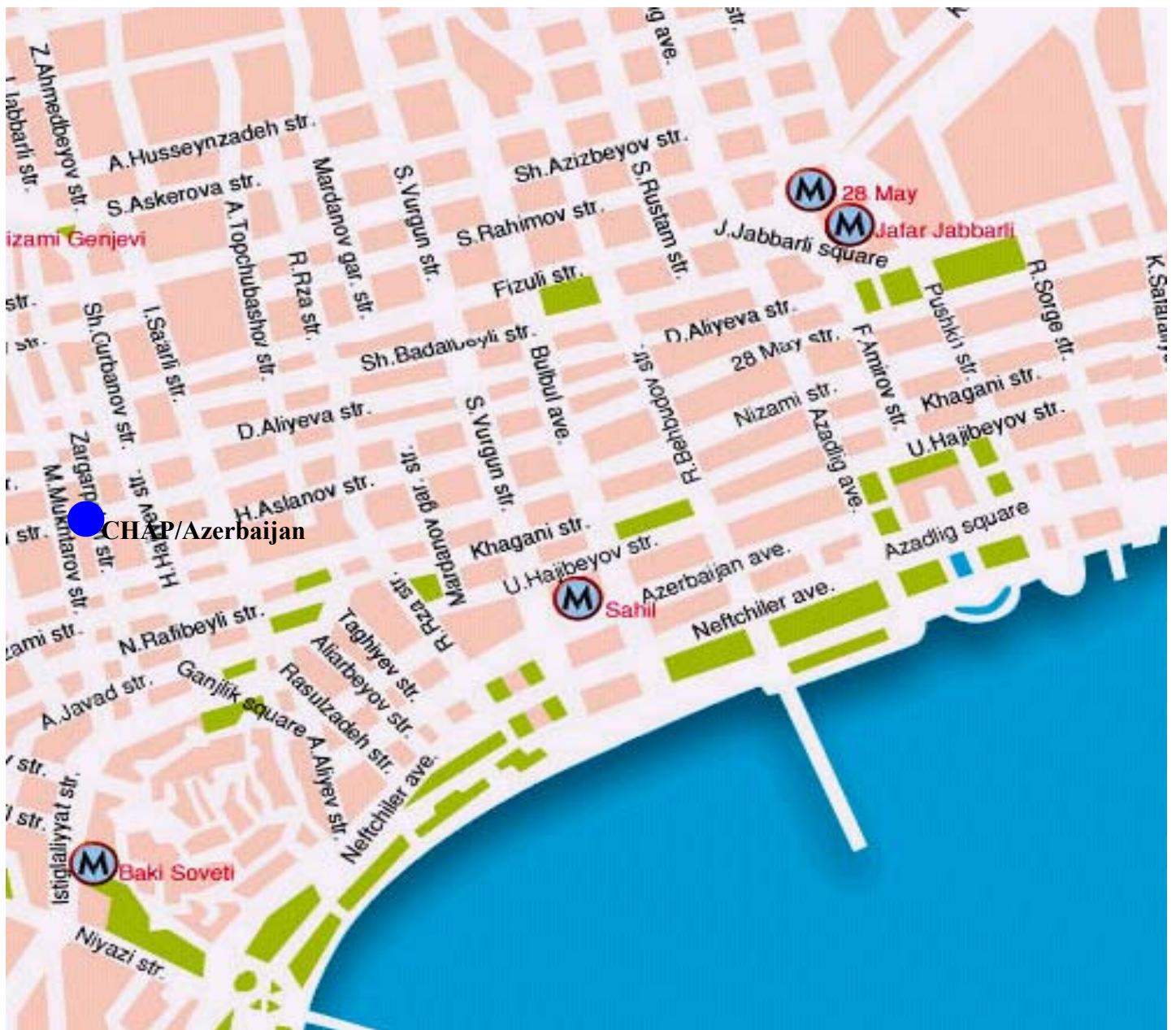
